Registration

It is important for all dogs and cats at each residents within the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder to be registered. Registration helps us to reunite lost pets with their owners. Pets can be registered for 1 year, 3 years or a lifetime.

Requirements

- Dogs over the age of 3 months are required to be registered and microchipped.
- Cats over the age of 6 months are required to be registered and microchipped. They are also recommended to be sterilised.
- Ensure your pet is always wearing their tag so they can be easily identified.
- A permit must be issued to your property if you own two or more dogs, or two or more cats.

*Note proof of sterilisation and microchipping must be shown before a cat can be registered. Proof of microchipping is required for dogs only.

Dog Prohibited Areas

Certain parks and grounds are designated for specific activities which make them not suitable as dog areas. Such parks and grounds include sporting grounds and wildlife sanctuaries.

Areas which dogs are prohibited from are:

- Diggers Daws Oval (Burt Street)
- Morrison Oval (Marshall Street)
- Sir Richard Moore Oval (Piccadilly Street)
- Cruickschanks Arena (YMCA Way)
- Hammond Park (Memorial Drive)
- Oasis Playing Fields (Osmetti Drive)
- **Kingsbury Park** (Macdonald Street)

Dogs are permitted on-lead at any other parks located in the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder. A good way to remember this is any park with a playground will require a dog to be on-lead. Remember to read the signs before entering an area.


Fines may be occurred if not adhering to the above.




Dog Permitted **Off-Lead**

Off-Lead Dog Exercise Areas

You can walk your dog off-lead at the follow parks:

- a. Arboretum (Hawkins St)
- **b. Edwards Park** (Piccadilly St)
- c. Wallace Park (Bourke/Collins St)

Between the hours of 5.00am - 8.00am only

- d. Shepherdson Park (Piccadilly/Throssell St)
- e. Gribble Creek (Speculation Area)
- **f. Gribble Creek** (Area between Johnston St, Kingsmill St and Wittenoom St)

g. Rasmussen Park (Broadwood St)

Excluding the Children's Playground area

- **h. Dwyer Street Dam** (Ivanhoe St)
- i. Norkal Park (Vivian St)
- j. Bushland & Gribble Creek (Surrounds along Vivian St)
