## Points of Interest



George Kasper started to build the castle as a hobby in 1976, and finished it in 1978. George used local stones from approximately a 482km radius of Kalgoorlie and residents supported him by gathering the stones. There are approximately 40,000 gemstones decorating the castle.



The beautiful heritage listed rotunda is over 100 years old and is the largest in Western Australia. It was built in 1903 by Edward Sears's for a sum of £279/10/-. The rotunda was relocated from the former Victoria Park Gardens in 2001.

## Hammond Park Guidelines for Visitors

*In the interests of ensuring the park is a place for the whole community, visitors are asked to adhere to the following guidelines:*

- *No dogs, cats or other domestic animals.*
- *littering the facility, i.e. BBQs, picnic areas and playground area. Rubbish bins are provided in these areas.*
- *Do Not leave children unsupervised in the park areas.*
- *Walking on garden beds or pick parts of plants and their flowers.*
- *Do Not feed birds and animals, unless the food is provided by the park. **Any other type of food, like bread, can impact on the animals health.***
- *Do Not use an area that has been reserved for a party or function. When areas are reserved there will be signs to advise you.*
- *Do Not bring vehicles into the park area unless approval has been obtained from the booking officer.*

***Please adhere to all regulatory signage displayed at key entrance locations inside the park.***

***Toddlers learning to use bikes or scooters are allowed on paths accompanied by a responsible adult.***

***Please be courteous and ensure activities do not adversely disrupt other park users.***

***Please clean BBQ'S after use***
