WILLIAM GRUNDT MEMORIAL LIBRARY INTERNET ACCESS GUIDELINES

The William Grundt Memorial Library Internet Access Guidelines allows equitable access to the Internet by as many library patrons as possible. All visitors wishing to use the public Internet PCs or the free Wi-Fi within the library must comply with these guidelines.

All material displayed on the screen must be appropriate to a public access site. Non-compliance will result in the suspension of library privileges.

- Charges apply to members and non members of the library at a cost set annually under the Schedule of Fees & Charges.
- Sessions are 15, 30 or 60 minutes.
- Web based email accounts can be accessed through the library computers, but due to the high bandwidth required featured films and music cannot be downloaded.
- The viewing of movies and videos and playing of some online games is also not permitted.
- Patrons must cease all activity including printing and downloading or uploading and vacate the PC at five minutes before closing time.
- If a current session is due to expire, the current patron may continue to use a PC on the condition that they confirm the use of the PC for the next hour with a staff member. They may continue to use the PC only if it is not required by another patron, or until the next hour has lapsed.
- If a patron has already had a computer session on the same day, they may be required to relinquish the PC to another borrower, upon request by a library staff member.
- Should part of a patron's time be lost due to technical problems, the patron will still be
 obliged to vacate the terminal at the end of their booking for the next person. There
 will be no refund of any fee.
- Printing facilities are available at a cost set annually under the Schedule of Fees & Charges.
- Patrons are responsible for any material printed during their session intended or otherwise.
- Patrons must abide by Copyright Laws when printing material from the Internet.

Supervision of Children

Parents are required to supervise children in their care at all times and not leave them unsupervised in the library whilst on the Internet. Staff reserve the right to ask a parent or guardian to remove a child from the designated computer room if their presence is causing a disruption to other patrons.



Internet Filtering

The City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder reserves the right to control the Internet service it provides and the City's decision will be final. The list of product categories currently blocked through our Internet access is attached. Patrons have the right to apply in writing to have a particular site made exempt from this filtering and must supply appropriate justification.

Disclaimer

Every endeavour will be made to provide reasonable Internet access for all patrons, however, library staff reserves the right to cancel a session should it become necessary to do so.
